# Transparency, Vigilance and Ethics in Public Procurement Towards a Brighter Future"

**INTRODUCTION:** Corruption is a global problem which is deep rooted in society, government & private. It significantly undermines a nation's development by eroding trust, hinders economic growth and weakens the social fabric of the country. Corruption can't be eradicated completely as it is dependent on various sociological factors like culture, moral education & ethics, economic conditions. However, it can be curbed by using technology, clear understanding of policy guidelines, awareness of stakeholders and role of overseeing agencies like CVC, CBI & CAG etc. Ethics & moral education with spiritual awakening of the people in profession are also very important to reduce corruption.

Based on surveys of the perception of various segments of society, Corruption Perception Index for the country is determined and countries are ranked. Country with higher rank is better or we can say that perceived corruption is less in that country. Present govt. is laying utmost thrust on use of technology, faceless & contactless approval of contracts for enhancing transparency and bringing clarity in policy guidelines to enhance delivery & reducing risk for stakeholders.

Decision making in Government is often affected by fear of Vigilance, more so when it involves financial decisions like those in Public Procurement of Goods, Works & Services. Such decisions have direct impact on fulfilling Service expectations of citizens, Business opportunities for industry partners and respective interests of other stakeholders. Shortcomings and weaknesses in decision making process are potential cases for complaints, harassment of honest decision makers and corruption opportunity for others. We also feel bad when we find ourselves, as a country, at lower pedestals in rankings of Transparency International; Corruption Perception Index etc. with respect to other countries. Can we improve these ranking? Yes, awareness of officials is an important solution.

To prevent corruption and encourage ethics in professional working, we do have enforcement and control agencies like Comptroller and Auditor General (CAG), Public Accounts Committee (PAC), Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) and Chief Vigilance Commission (CVC). Have they succeeded in eliminating corruption or become responsible for paralysing processes? Can we deal with it? Yes, awareness of officials is an important solution.

There is a large group of honest Public Servants who are paralyzed into inaction due to fears of system. Can we deal with it? Yes, awareness of officials is an important solution.

The evil of corruption in Public Procurement needs be eliminated for good? Considering the example of Scandinavian countries, there is a hope that it can be done. But it has to be a multi pronged strategy, laws and punishments alone may not be sufficient. We all have to realise, train and contribute our might.
